AROUND THE ROOMS

F-2 Class

One of our highlights over the last few weeks was reading a story called 'The Concrete Garden', by Bob Graham. It's a lovely story and we finished by creating our own 'garden' on the basketball court which you can enjoy in the photos. Our latest book is called 'The Imagineer', through which we are learning lots of interesting words like 'miniscule', 'massive', 'persistent' and 'created'. The children used their imaginations and drew some amazing 'creative ideas' themselves. We will write some sentences next week using adjectives, building on our understanding of what a sentence is and how we can expand them.

In Sounds Write, the Foundation group are starting to blend 4 sounds which can be a little tricky to hear that extra sound. For the rest of this term, we are focused on revising what we have learned and practising reading words and sentences as much as possible. Keep an eye on the book that comes home with their reader, as it will have some extra high frequency words to keep practising.

In Maths we have begun to look at sharing and grouping. The 1/2s have worked really hard developing their understanding of multiplication and now working on division (which starts off using the 'sharing ad grouping language'). They continue to practise their number facts each day as well.

In Geography, we are learning about maps and what they can be used for. We have been learning very generally about the different continents, countries and oceans, focusing mainly on Australia, the states and some main features. The students wrote information about koalas, kangaroos and wombats. We will continue to look at the globe and maps so that we have some concepts about where we are in the world.

The students keep working so well.

- **2. Listen:** Give them your undivided attention and create a safe space for them to share what's on their mind
- **3. Encourage action:** Ask what they think might help and how you can support them, or suggest they speak to a doctor or another support service.
- 4. Check in: Follow up with them after a few days or weeks to see how they're doing.


