

Term 1 Week 10

Pupil Free Day Monday, 24th April—Focus on Numeracy

School Council has approved a pupil a pupil free day for the first day of Term 2. Teachers will be building their professional knowledge on teaching numeracy with a focus on "The Big Idea' in numeracy.

Research has shown us that some students who are struggling with numeracy have gaps in their knowledge in critical areas. Our focus will be on the first two areas Trusting the Count and Place Value. Trusting the Count involves students having a mental picture of numbers. Imagine dice where numbers are represented by dots. If you see a three and a four it is highly likely you don't count the numbers but intuitively know what these numbers look like. You also likely know that these numbers can be represented in a variety of different configurations. Students need a robust mental picture of numbers. Our second focus area will be Place Value. Our numeration system requires students to have a robust understanding of the Base 10 system (one's, tens, hundreds etc.) Students need to know that the 3 in 36 represent 3 tens and that 3 tens is bigger that 3 one's and smaller that 3 hundreds. This may sound simple, however the concepts involved can be quite tricky. Students need to be given multiple opportunities to explore relationships in maths.

Class Caterpillars

We loved seeing them grow fat like the caterpillar in 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and found that when we made loud noises, we could make them move their heads up and down. The students kept a diary documenting

the changes they saw. I have shared Jack's diary below.

Attendance Requirements

If your child is sick or absent, you are required to notify the school as soon as possible on the day of absence, through SkoolBag or phone

Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

From the end of Term 2 2018, all Victorian government schools are required to contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. If your child is absent on a particular day and you have not contacted the school to explain why or the school has not been able to contact you, the absence will be marked as unexplained.

This system also promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education, they learn new things every day – missing school puts them behind.
